## Dental Health Assessment - Dog



### STAGE 0 Clinically Normal

Your dog has healthy-looking teeth.



### STAGE 1 Gingivitis Only

Your dog may have bad breath, some tartar build-up and reddening of the gums.



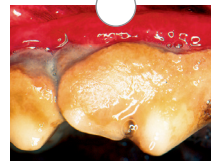
### STAGE 2 Early Periodontitis

You may notice their breath smelling stronger, redder gums, more tartar and some discoloration.



### STAGE 3 Moderate Periodontitis

This stage is characterized by very bad breath, a large build-up of tartar especially on molars, very discolored teeth and very red gums. Your dog may favor chewing on one side.



### STAGE 4 Advanced Periodontitis

You will likely notice your dog has severe bad breath and may show signs of pain, such as being head shy or dropping kibbles when they chew.

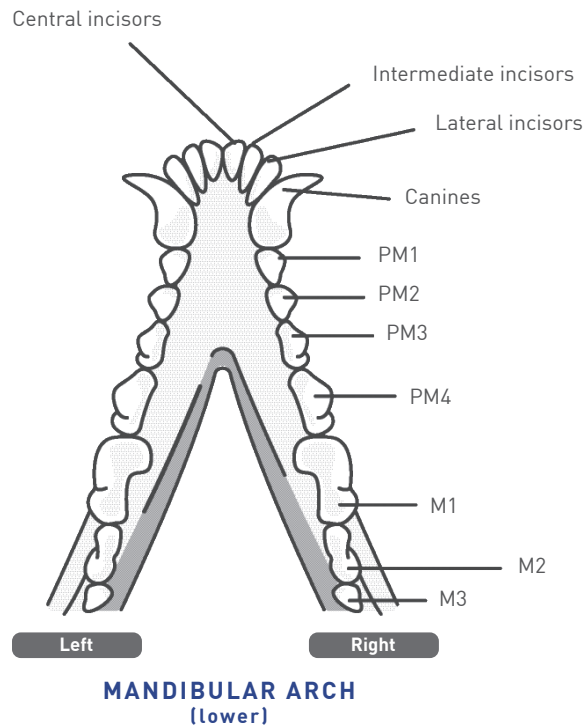
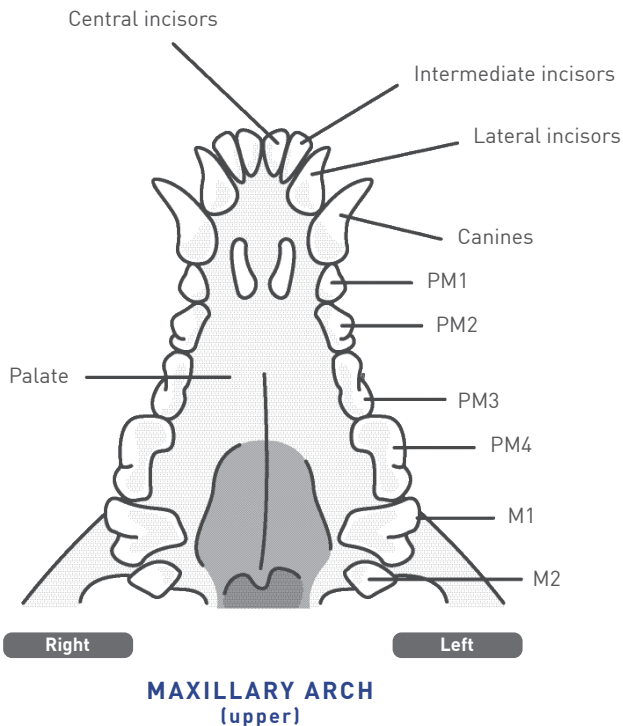
